

DONALD W. WYATT DETENTION FACILITY Sexual Abuse and Sexual Harassment Prevention Statement

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In keeping with Public Law 108-79 (i.e., the Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) of 2003), the facility will investigate and refer to outside law enforcement for prosecution, any activities involving such conduct. All detainees housed at the Donald W. Wyatt Detention Facility shall have the right to be safe from sexually abusive behavior.

The Donald W. Wyatt Detention Facility has a **ZERO TOLERANCE** policy against sexual abuse and is committed to respecting and protecting the rights of its incarcerated population. An incarcerated individual has the right against being pressured by anyone to engage in sexual acts and does not have to tolerate sexually abusive behavior or pressure to engage in unwanted sexual behavior from another detainee, staff member, contractor, or volunteer. Regardless of the detainee's age, size, race, ethnicity, gender or sexual orientation, he/she has the right to be safe from sexually abusive behavior.

Detainees are encouraged to immediately report allegations of sexually abusive behavior to a facility staff member they trust, the Office of Inspector General, or via the detainee grievance process. All allegations, including third-party reports, are confidential and will be thoroughly investigated.
